



Mwandi Updates:

There is a lot to report on this quarter so I'll try to condense this by using excerpts from Dr. Haamumba's Facebook post and Keith and Ida's "Partner's Plan".

Dr. Haamumba announced the coming of Dr. Peggy Scrieber and her team of surgeons. They will be in Mwandi for thirteen days in mid-April for a combination American Board meeting and her annual round of surgeries. Among the surgeries conducted will be Ear Nose and Throat, General Vascular Surgery, Rectal Surgery and Gynecology. He also praised Peggy for her long-time dedication to Mwandi. She has brought surgery teams to Mwandi for over twenty years and is currently the chairperson of the American Board. Good news!! The hospital has finally achieved Level II status. The impact of this is that they will be considered for more extensive support from the Zambia Health organizations and patients will no longer have to be sent to Livingston for more advanced treatments. Faced with traveling over the rotten road to Livingston and the additional expense to the patient's family, usually the patient just went home. Achievement of this status has been brought about largely by completion of the Diagnostic Center (X-ray, ECG, CT-Scan, and ultrasound), installation of an oxygen generation and distribution system, and receipt of a suction machine and hookups for ten beds from the Czech Embassy. However, this equipment is awaiting installation.

Kieth Wadell reports that they have had to lay off, or reduce hours, of some of the block makers as demand for their product has diminished. The blocks they make are of high quality, made with crushed rock trucked from miles away. The cost of 22 tons of the rock and transport to Mwandi is \$940, and this cost is on top of that for the inferior blocks made of just sand and cement. The blocks are therefore more expensive and only the hospital and a few NGOs constructing public buildings can afford to purchase them.

Kieth also reports that they have put another 1000 Tilapia fingerlings in one of the fish ponds. They also have two groups of so-called layer chicks but they have yet to be segregated by sex so there may be any number of broiler chickens on the way. As mentioned previously, the impact of El Nino has been devastating this year with only 50% of normal rainfall and temperatures about 50% higher than normal. The crops are dead and in the Mwandi region about 85% of households are facing food insecurity. The draught is nationwide and has caused the power company, ZESCO, to enforce 8hr daily rolling power outages. Not enough water is flowing down the Zambesi River to allow generation from the small hydro plant in Livingston or for the full generating capacity at the Kariba Dam generators. Fortunately, the hospital has some solar power and a petrol fired generator that allows them to operate at reduced efficiency during these blackouts.



Keith writes "The situation in Mwandi District is dire with 85% of households facing food insecurity from crop failure and 90% of the crops destroyed. We have supported World Renew here in their proposed food relief program and we have also through a supportive church in the USA been awarded a grant to go towards a nutrition program for malnourished patients in the hospital and also to provide a standard food package for selected vulnerable patients on their discharge". This situation has deprived many mothers of adequate nourishment to produce milk and has prompted our church's sending additional Formula for Life funds as formula is not a crop and can be purchased.

We in America should count our blessings and thank God for the abundance we have. Is it any wonder people from all over are wanting to enter our country. By: Bruce Eberhard

A roof company has been contracted; this work will be done once the HVAC units are installed.


The Giving Together Store


