Bruce Eberhard

I was born, raised, and educated K through 12 in Santa Clara, California. Over the years starting, in the eighth grade I have undertaken the construction of many projects. Why do I mention this? Because I am a strong advocate of at least minimal training in the manual arts. I have always liked to do things with my hands. For me it began in earnest in the eighth grade where I was exposed to the fundamentals in a required wood working class. In high school I followed an academic curriculum with a study hall period thrown in the mix. I considered this a waste of time and elected to take metal shop instead. It was then that I heard of metallurgy. I enrolled in Mining Engineering at the Colorado School of Mines intending to become a mining engineer. At the time all the mining engineering jobs were for coal mining. This occupation was not for me so I switched to Metallurgical Engineering, graduated in 1957, and haven't

regretted it. At school I met and later married Maxine. When we drove to Aiken we didn't have the proverbial pot. What personal belongings we had were packed in our 1950 Ford sedan along with a case of motor oil. Earning a minimal income at this time, I purchased a bare bones table saw and started to cobble up "makedo" furniture.

The hobby grew out of necessity. Eventually we were sufficiently affluent to own a home of our own, buy better equipment, and save a lot of money by making much of our own furniture. This experience evolved into doing a lot of similar work for others and the church. While compiling this list of projects I began to wonder how I managed to do it all while holding down a fulltime job, but the reality is it has all been done over a span of 68 years and not included is a lot of work done domestic and foreign mission trips and at the Aiken Railroad Depot and the Gaston Livery Stable.

The Thank Offering of Presbyterian Women has deep roots. In 1888 Eliza Clokey of Springfield, Ohio, challenged her fellow members to give one dollar in addition to their annual mission contribution. Thousands of people in all parts of our country receive benefits from this program.

Her example of giving has enabled PW to expand its giving as an example of our gratitude to God when we give to others. More than 40 percent of the ten projects selected for funding are related to health funding. One of the projects chosen is named Lynchburg Daily Bread, which serves 800 hot, nutritious, delicious meals every day with respect – and without condition. The Thank Offering grant will provide a generator to sustain their daily meal program and provide uninterrupted service even during emergencies." This project received \$22,800. Īsaiah 13:19 says, "Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." Thank you, God, for these gifts from the Thank Offering which enrich lives and remind us of your love, goodness, and mercy. Amen.
